A Guide to the Papers and Research Materials of Joy Leland Collection No. 96-07

Dr. Joy Leland, Ph.D., is a research professor emeritus of Anthropology, Desert Research Institute (DRI) of the University of Nevada (1989). She received the following degrees: B.A., Pomona College, 1949; M.B.A., Stanford University, 1960; M.A., University of Nevada, Reno, 1972; and Ph.D., University of California, Irvine, 1975.

Dr. Leland began working for the DRI in 1961. Her research was in the field of anthropology, focusing on studies of alcohol and health issues among urban Native Americans. She is the author of many articles in professional journals, professional papers, and the following books:

- We Need to be Shown: A Study of the Talents, Work Potential and Aspirations of the Pyramid Lake Indians by William Gomberg and Joy Leland (1962)
- *Great Basin Indian Population Figures (1873-1979) and the Pitfalls Therein* (1976)
- Drinking Styles in an Indian Settlement: A Numerical Folk Taxonomy. M.A. Thesis, University of California, Irvine (1975)
- Firewater Myths: North American Indian Drinking and Alcohol Addiction (1976)
- Frederick West Lander: A Biographical Sketch (1822-1862), edited by Joy Leland with contributions by Mavis Shahrani, Joy Leland, and Alice Baldrica (1993).

Scope and Content

The papers and research materials of Joy Leland consists of 15 cu. ft. and covers the years 1979-1995. The collection was donated to the Special Collections Department by Joy Leland in 1996. There are some restrictions on the use of the collection, which are covered below.

The collection is divided into two series: Series I, questionnaires and reports for Dr. Leland's research project, "Alcohol in the Lives of Some Indian Women;" and Series II, research notes for Dr. Leland's biography of Frederick West Lander. There are some restrictions on the use of the material included in Series II which contains restrictions concerning copyright provisions. An explanation of the copyright restriction follows below. At a future date, Dr. Leland will be donating the key to the identity of the subjects by number for the questionnaires in Series I; they will be restricted for a time period specified by Dr. Leland.

Dr. Leland received a grant from the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism to conduct research on the effect of alcohol in the lives of some Indian women. The data was gathered in 1980 in a Nevada urban Indian settlement. A random sample of 175 interviews (85% of the census list of 207 females) yielded 149 usable interviews. Four schedules were developed:

- Schedule 1: Demographic data on subject and family members
- Schedule 2: Questions concerning the subject's attempts to cope with the drinking problems caused by two people: the person in Schedule 1 and the person covered in Schedule 4

- Schedule 3: Questions concerning the subject's attempts own drinking, including the drinking troubles questions referred to in schedule 1, and
- Schedule 4: Questions concerning the drinking of another person whose drinking has caused the subject trouble.

Series I, which is contained in seven cu. ft., includes copies of the questions and responses which are identified by a number only; a separate key to the identities of the subjects.

The results of this survey are summarized in professional papers presented to the Alcohol Research Group, University of CaLifornia, Berkeley, 1987; a Symposium on Alcohol and Minority Women at the meetings of the Research Society on Alcohol, 1995; and a report to the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism, 1982. Those papers and reports are part of this collection.

Series II contains research materials gathered for the book, *Frederick West Lander: A Biographical Sketch* (1822-1862), edited by Joy Leland with contributions by Mavis Shahrani, Joy Leland, and Alice Baldrica (Reno: Desert Research Institute Publications in the Social Sciences No. 15, 1993).

This biography was the fulfillment of a condition of an endowment to the DRI's Center for Western North American Studies from Anna Lander West McDonnell. McDonnell (1872-1966) was the daughter of Frederick Lander's brother, Charles West. Upon her death a portion of her estate was willed to DRI; the remainder of the estate came to DRI upon the death of her other beneficiary.

Dr. Leland and research assistants Mavis Shahrani and Alice Baldrica began gathering Lander biographical materials in 1979 and in 1988 they decided to publish their chronological compendium of facts in the Desert Research Institute Publications in the Social Sciences series. After the publication of the biography, the gathered materials were donated to the Special Collections Department. They included some original personal papers of Mrs. McDonnell's which had been stored in her safety deposit box and which were donated to the DRI after her death. The McDonnell papers have been accessioned separately as manuscript collection 96-13; a collection guide is available.

The contents of Series II are contained in eight cu. ft. Included are a copy of the published biography, and photocopies of manuscript and published materials in the Library of Congress; the National Archives of the United States; the Essex Institute, Salem, Massachusetts; Peabody Museum of Salem, Massachusetts; and several other research institutions identified on the papers. In addition to photocopies there is microfilm of materials in the National Archives, the Universities of California at Los Angeles and Berkeley, and Yale University. Oversize materials include copies of maps from other institutions, maps compiled for the biography, and oversize photocopies of Lander materials.

With the exception of the McDonnell collection materials, all of the above mentioned Lander research materials are under copyright restrictions. Â The Special Collections Department does not own any copy or literary rights to this collection. Â Researchers wishing copies of these materials or planning to publish them should contact the original owners of those papers as noted in each folder.
