NEW YORK -- Wish you could make your student loans disappear?

Student loan forgiveness programs can make it happen, but there's a problem.

"There needs to be more awareness about these programs," says Betsy Mayotte, director of regulatory compliance at American Student Assistance, a nonprofit that helps borrowers manage their student debt.

So the organization released a student loan forgiveness guide earlier this year on its website. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, a government watchdog, released its own guide last month to bring attention to the programs.

The programs are not a quick fix. Instead, they enable borrowers to erase their remaining student debt after several years of payments. Most of the programs are tied to certain low-paid professions, such as teachers or public defenders, and have other restrictions. Here's a snapshot of several options.

PUBLIC SERVICE PROGRAM

This program is for those who work in federal, state or local government jobs, or at a nonprofit that's been designated as a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization. The CFPB estimates that a quarter of the country's workforce falls into those categories. Individuals must also have high student loan balances relative to their income.

The program works like this: anyone who makes 120 on-time monthly payments toward their student loans and works in a qualifying job for 10 years (they don't have to be consecutive), can apply to have their remaining balance forgiven. The amount of the loans forgiven is not taxed, under current tax law.

Only those with federal Direct Loans will qualify for this program, but some loans, such as the Federal Family Education Loan (also known as FFEL) and the Perkins Loan can be consolidated into a Direct Loan. If you don't know what type of federal loan you have, you can find out at nslds.ed.gov.

The program was established in 2007, so no one has received loan forgiveness yet. Those hoping to take advantage need to make sure their job qualifies with the Department of Education every year, says Mark Kantrowitz, publisher of Edvisors.com. Save the paperwork and annual income forms, in case you need to later prove your eligibility.

INCOME-BASED REPAYMENT

Under this program borrowers can qualify for reduced monthly payments, and after 25 years the remaining balance is forgiven. It is important to note that the forgiven amount is taxed as income, which means you will likely have to pay a sum to the IRS that's lower than the amount forgiven.

The program is for those whose federal student loan debt is high relative their income and family size. Your lender will ultimately decide if you are qualified, but you can see if you would benefit from this program by using this online calculator: . http://l.usa.gov/1bIO1yw

PAY AS YOU EARN PLAN

Borrowers can apply to have their monthly payments reduced, and after 20 years of payments, the balance is forgiven. Any forgiven amounts are taxed as income. This program is for those

with a high level of federal student loans compared to their income, and who took out their first federal student loan after Oct. 1, 2007.

OTHER PROGRAMS

Depending on your job, you may be able to get help with your loans.

Teachers, for example, should see if they're eligible for the teacher loan forgiveness program. They must work at a qualifying school for five consecutive years to receive up to \$17,500 in forgiveness on certain federal loans. For more details see: . http://l.usa.gov/lbITqWq

American Student Assistance put a list together of over 60 programs. Some are based on type of job, others are state programs. You can see them here: . Some state programs even help with private loans. Mayotte of ASA recommends an Internet search to see if your state or job qualifies for some sort of student loan help. She says it's important to ask your employers or human resources department if student loan help is available. She says more employers are refunding a part their employee's student loan payments. http://bit.ly/15xGpNs

Mayotte also warns that borrowers shouldn't take jobs just to have their student loans forgiven, or take out too much debt because they assume their debt will be forgiven. Many of the programs are budget based, there's a possibility that some could disappear or not be around by the time you graduate, Mayotte says.

Avon Breast Health Outreach Program

The mission of the Avon Breast Health Outreach Program (BHOP) is to link medically underserved women and men to breast health education and screening services. Grants are available to community-based nonprofit organizations and healthcare agencies in the U.S., Guam, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The Avon BHOP supports non-medical expenses incurred by funded programs to link underserved women with free or low-cost breast cancer screening services and follow-up care. Approximately \$2.5 million in grant funds will be awarded to around 50 organizations. The majority of the grants will range from \$30,000 to \$60,000, with an average of \$45,000. To ensure that smaller community-based organizations receive funding, at least 30% of the grants will be awarded to organizations with operating budgets under \$2,000,000. Projects in Avon Walk Cities as well as states with high breast cancer incidence or morbidity are of special interest; however, BHOP attempts to distribute funds throughout the entire U.S. The application deadline is August 22, 2014. Native American Communities Funded

Seventh Generation Fund for Indigenous Peoples

The Seventh Generation Fund for Indigenous Peoples is dedicated to promoting and maintaining the uniqueness of Native peoples and the sovereignty of tribal Nations. The Fund's primary grantmaking program areas include the following: Arts and Cultural Expression, Environmental Health and Justice, Human Rights, Sustainable Communities, Intergenerational Leadership, and Women's Leadership. Grants from \$600 to \$5,000 are provided to Native communities that address one or more of the Fund's program areas. The upcoming application deadline is September 15, 2014. (Mini-grants of up to \$500 are reviewed throughout the year.) Application guidelines and forms are available on the Fund's website.

Grants Promote Youth Running Programs

Road Runners Club of America: Kids Run the Nation Fund

The Road Runners Club of America (RRCA) is dedicated to supporting the growth of grassroots running clubs, training programs, and running events while promoting the common interests of runners throughout the United States. The Kids Run the Nation Fund, an initiative of the RRCA, supports nonprofit organizations and schools in the U.S. that are interested in implementing or currently have a youth running program. Grants of \$500 to \$1,000 are provided to running clubs and other nonprofit organizations such as parent booster clubs, PTAs, etc. Elementary and middle schools that provide organized after-school running programs are also eligible to apply. Since the goal of the grant program is to have kids running at least once a week for multiple weeks, funded running programs should offer more than just one-time events. Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention Initiatives for Youth Supported

AMA Foundation: Healthy Living Grant Program

The Healthy Living Grant Program, an initiative of the AMA Foundation, supports grassroots public health projects that encourage health education in communities across the nation. In 2014,

grants will be awarded in the Prescription Medication Safety category. Funded projects should provide awareness programs about the dangers of prescription drug abuse for children and youth ages 2 to 21. Nonprofit organizations and government agencies that have been in existence for at least one year and that have an annual operating budget of \$2 million or less are eligible to apply. The proposed project must involve a partnership with a medical organization. The application deadline is September 12, 2014. Application guidelines and forms are available on the Foundation's website.

Funds for Neighborhood Projects in Delaware, New Jersey, and Eastern Pennsylvania Wells Fargo Regional Foundation

Support for Children's Healthcare and Cancer Treatment in Washington, DC The Alexander and Margaret Stewart Trust

The Alexander and Margaret Stewart Trust supports nonprofit organizations that focus on researching, treating, and preventing cancer and pediatric illnesses. The Trust offers grants to organizations that assist residents of Washington, DC, particularly in economically disadvantaged communities. Grants support a range of organizations, from health clinics and hospitals to community-based organizations, which provide pediatric care or cancer treatment for the underprivileged. Grant applications are accepted throughout the year. Applications submitted by September 19, 2014, should receive a decision before the end of the year. (New applicants

must submit a letter of inquiry form prior to applying.) Visit the Trust's website to learn more about the grant guidelines and application procedure.

Healthy Watershed Initiatives in Texas Funded

Dixon Water Foundation

The Dixon Water Foundation is dedicated to promoting healthy watersheds through good land management throughout key ecosystems in the state of Texas. The Foundation focuses on education, outreach, and research on water issues, with a particular emphasis on ecologically and financially sustainable land management that will enhance water retention and minimize erosion in watersheds in the state. Nonprofit organizations with programs that address the Foundation's priorities are eligible to apply. The upcoming grant application deadline is September 1, 2014.
