National Parks Advisory Board Members Quit over Administration Disinterest: Congress chartered the <u>National Park Service Advisory Board</u> (NPSAB) in 1935 as a 12-member group dedicated to helping the <u>National Park Service</u> (NPS). The current board was appointed by President Obama and represents the geographical breadth of the US and a range of research disciplines. This week, <u>10 of the 12 members quit, citing</u> <u>Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke's unwillingness to meet</u>. Former Alaska Governor Tony Knowles said the Department of the Interior "showed no interest in learning about or continuing to use the forward-thinking agenda of science, the effect of climate change, protections of the ecosystems, education."

A 2016 presidential order called for a focus on climate change in managing natural resources in US parks. Park managers were to make decisions based "on science, law and long-term public interest," and park superintendents and other NPS leaders had to "possess scientific literacy appropriate to their positions and resource management decision-making responsibilities." Last August the Trump administration scrapped that order. Additionally, <u>Trump has rolled back protections for national parks and public lands</u>, including a downsize of two national monuments in Utah and announcing plans to <u>allow drilling in protected areas of the Arctic and the Atlantic Oceans</u>.
