Stop tar sands & support Indigenous rights

Three days ago, Minnesota officials voted to move ahead with their decision on the Line 3 pipeline without assessing the Indigenous lands and sacred sites that would be impacted. But there's still one more chance for them to reassess.

Line 3 is one of three proposed major tar sands pipelines that, if built, would violate Indigenous rights and send our climate past a tipping point. We need to stop these pipelines and keep climate-killing tar sands in the ground.

Speak out against the Line 3 pipeline – submit a public comment to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission urging them to reject this project before the period closes this Tuesday, February 27th. (Sorry, rc'd 2.27 but you can continue to watch this situation)

This is the last opportunity for the public to weigh in on Line 3 before the Minnesota PUC decides on the permits this June.

The Commissioners need to know that the world is watching this decision and the more people who submit comments, the more pressure we can generate. Comments will only be accepted until Tuesday -- so we need to act now.

<u>Send your comment now urging the Commission to protect our climate and communities, and reject the Line 3 pipeline.</u>

While we still hope to force the Commission to include the tribal survey, this fight is far from over. Even without the survey, the PUC has plenty of reasons to reject this pipeline – it's a catastrophe for Indigenous rights, clean water, and the climate and should not be built.

This fight is bigger than just Line 3 – every pipeline and fossil fuel project we resist sends the message that we won't let this dirty industry harm our communities or our climate. We need a just and equitable transition to a sustainable world, and we need it now.

During these final few months before the PUC commissioners vote on the project, we must keep pushing and leave nothing on the table. <u>Submit your comment now.</u>

Together, all of us united, will stop this pipeline and every other pipeline that threatens our climate and communities.


