***Today's verdict should send a message: if you endanger our environment and wildlife, we will hold you accountable.” –Xavier Becerra, California's Attorney General, in reference to a 2015 oil spill that occurred when a corroded pipeline ruptured and sent 123,000 gallons of crude oil into the state's coastal waters. On Friday, a California jury found the Plains All American Pipeline company guilty of nine criminal charges from the spill, including failure to maintain the pipeline and killing marine mammals and seabirds.
