



### **Habitat restoration project yields unprecedented results for coho salmon**

MENDOCINO COUNTY, Calif. – Scientists and conservationists are reporting the return of spawning coho salmon to the upper reaches of a tributary of Big River, thanks to a four-year habitat restoration project led by Mendocino Land Trust in partnership with California Department of Fish and Wildlife and Jackson Demonstration State Forest. Initial post-restoration informal surveying has already shown increased coho salmon spawning activity, demonstrated by several coho salmon nests (known as redds) and coho salmon carcasses upstream from the restoration site.

### **California national parks, wilderness areas, to expand under sweeping new bill**

In the largest land conservation bill passed by Congress in 10 years, vast areas of California's desert are headed for new protections that would prohibit mining, roads and off-highway vehicles, and enlarge two national parks, Death Valley and Joshua Tree. The bill would designate 1.3 million acres of federal land across the American West as wilderness, the highest level of protection, establish four new national monuments, and set aside more than 600 miles of rivers from dams and other development. In a Congress that has spent years in bitter partisan division, the legislation was an unusual point of agreement, passing the House and Senate with large bipartisan support.

**Environmental win:** A bill on its way to President Trump's desk would drastically increase protections for California's desert lands, including expanding two national parks. And **the president, no friend of the state, is expected to sign it.**

"The effects (of mining) on the air, on the water, worry us." –Victor Martinez Lobato, an indigenous leader in Tecoltemi, Mexico, in reference to the impacts of mining activities on ancestral lands. Mexico's mining law prioritizes mining over other land use rights, including indigenous land titles. Later this month, a court will rule for the first time on the constitutionality of the mining law. The case involves accusations that mining activities in 2016 near the town of Ixtacamxtitlan caused contamination of water sources. *Reuters*

In an article released by CBS News, we learn about a man from Indiana, Don Miller, who was known to be a collector of "artifacts." All of these artifacts were in fact stolen from native graves and other places around the world, in violation of many laws. The FBI recently raided the home of the now deceased Don Miller and recovered the bones of nearly 500 native ancestors.

Experts determined the remains found at Miller's residence likely came from Native American tribes including the Arikara. In North Dakota, tribal official Pete Coffey is working with the FBI to bring them home."

## 40-plus entities formulate 'New Nevada' workforce coalition

In what's being described as "a sweeping show of commitment to the future economic vitality of Northern Nevada," more than 40 public and private entities, including representatives from Carson City, have joined to form the Career and Technical Education Messaging Coalition of Northern Nevada, officials announced Feb. 27. According to a news release, the coalition's main goal is to match potential employees with the many job and certificate opportunities available in "the New Nevada."

"With unemployment at a record low, there's an increasing shortage of employees or job-seekers qualified for many of the jobs available in the New Nevada economy," Mike Kazmierski, CEO of the Economic Development Authority of Western Nevada (EDAWN), one of the coalition's partners, in a statement. "A four-year degree is not required

for almost 80 percent of the new jobs in the region, as most employers are looking for skilled talent only requiring a high school diploma and industry-recognized certificates or an associate degree."

The coalition has also launched a new website, [NewNevadaJobs.com](http://NewNevadaJobs.com), to provide students, graduates and job seekers one point of access to research employment and connect to training and job placement, while also allowing companies to brand to potential employees.

The main industries of employment on which the coalition focuses are advanced manufacturing, construction, healthcare, hospitality management, logistics and technology, among other growth industries.
