People in each era examine the past for guidance, reinterpret its lessons in light of their own needs and perceptions, and act, thereby creating a record for those who follow. The accumulated capital in this memory bank comprises that culture's archives, that information of enduring value. As the memory bank of Nevada government, the State Archives preserves and makes available information that enables all citizens to better understand how public policy evolves from the past, governs the present, and affects the future.

The State Archives is the institutional memory of state government. Along with records management and micrographics and imaging, it is an integral part of the life cycle management of state government records. The State Archives is the legal custodian of the historical records of the territory and state as defined in state law, representing the official actions of all three branches of government as required by NRS 378.230 and 378.280. It preserves those records for the continuity of government and provides public access to them for citizen accountability and the maintenance of rights and entitlements. Archives staff provides leadership and

professional guidance to local and tribal governments and local museums and historical societies and libraries through training classes in archival practices, preservation and disaster planning. This professional expertise cannot be found anywhere else in the state

NS/S is pleased to offer small donations of our seeds to eligible organizations in the Greater Southwest region. The grants are designed to support the work of educators and those working to enhance the lives of underprivileged groups in the region, while simultaneously keeping locally-adapted crop varieties alive and in active use in farms and gardens. See below for requirements and instructions for applying to this donation program.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE

- Seed Grants are restricted to organizations operating in our area of focus: the southwestern U.S. and northwestern Mexico. Our seeds are best adapted to this region and are most meaningful to the people who have inhabited, or whose descendants continue to inhabit, this region.
- Grants are open to organizations working on educational, food security, or community development projects.
- Priority is given to projects that will clearly benefit underprivileged groups
- Seed Grants are Not available to individuals
- Note: Native American Individuals living in the Greater Southwest or belonging to tribes in the region are automatically eligible for free

seeds under our [Native American Seed Request](#), (Native American Organizations should apply through the link on this page)

Examples of successful seed grants include school gardens, demonstration gardens for seed libraries, community therapy or rehabilitation gardens, senior center gardens, and other community oriented gardens.

WHAT CAN I REQUEST?

- An organization may request up to thirty (30) standard seed packets with no more than three (3) packets of a single **non-restricted** variety and no more than one (1) packet of a **restricted or "member only"** variety
- Exceptions may be made under special circumstances, but quantities may still be limited if demand is high.
- Refer to our [online catalog](#) to select available varieties
- Substitutions may be made by NS/S if availability of requested seeds is limited
- Donated seeds are from the current year's catalog stock and are guaranteed to meet minimum state and federal germination requirements for commercially sold seeds
- Not Included: Seed Buckets, Seed Collections, Non WF coded wildflowers, Seed Saving materials

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS?

- Seeds donated through this program will not be sold
- All reasonable attempts will be made to save viable seeds from the grant project to distribute to individuals or organizations in need
- *(Photo taken at Ochoa Community School in Tucson, AZ)* information about how the seeds fared, will
- A brief report on the outcome of the project, including photographs (if possible) and be sent to NS/S upon project completion. Report guidelines will be emailed with a report deadline reminder.
- Information about how the seeds are used may be included in NS/S publications. Grantees may be highlighted in the NS/S newsletter, [The Seedhead News](#), or online including the NS/S website as well as NS/S social media.

The **Department of the Interior just announced a one-year moratorium on oil and gas leasing within a 10-mile radius of Chaco Culture National Historical Park**. This move comes after intense public outcry and pressure to protect this cultural site.

At the same time, legislators from New Mexico have introduced federal bills that would make these protections permanent. We still have plenty of work to do -- lease sales outside of the buffer zone are still moving ahead in June and community health and safety still remain an issue. But this is a step in the right direction, and I hope you'll take a minute to celebrate. We couldn't have done it without you!

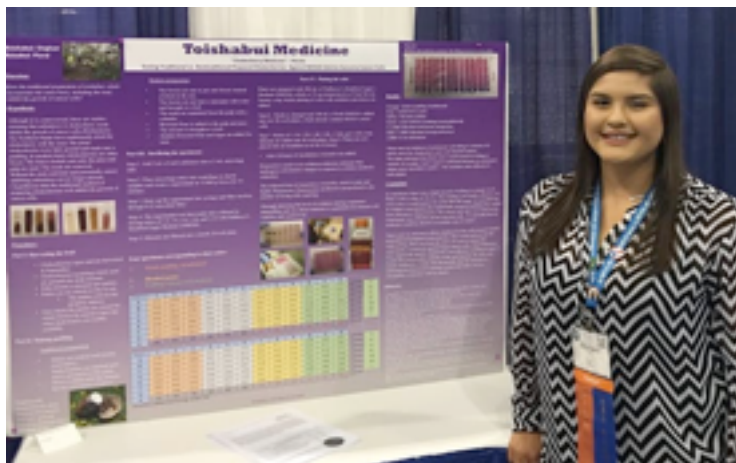
