

Michigan Offers Free Community College Education to Essential Workers

September 24, 2020 by <u>Susan Dutca-Lovell</u> The state of Michigan is set to offer two years of free community college to essential workers who were required by their job to leave the house and work at least 11 weeks in the spring during the coronavirus pandemic. This unique opportunity, called Futures for Frontliners, opens doors to essential workers who are not commonly considered front-line workers and an estimated 600,000 residents could qualify. [...]

<u>Colleges Waiving SAT and ACT Requirements for Merit Scholarships</u> <u>September 22, 2020</u> by <u>Izzy Hall</u>

Many colleges have waived SAT and ACT score requirements for high school seniors currently applying to college due to how difficult it has been to sign up for standardized testing during the coronavirus pandemic. Now some colleges are also waiving standardized test score requirements when awarding merit scholarships to incoming students. Instead of requiring SAT and ACT scores, these schools will award scholarships based on high school GPA. [...]
