Recently, a workgroup was convened of more than 50 people who were responsible for this year's review of drafting social study standards for South Dakota schools.

The group included K-12 educators, post-secondary representatives, parents and representatives of business and industry. The group put together an unprecedented curriculum designed to teach about the Lakota people, how our history has intertwined, and our present-day situation.

Unfortunately, the bureaucrats and politicians who commissioned the work group gutted the portion of the curriculum regarding our Indigenous people.

There is so much that must be taught to the children in order for them to understand the world they will inherit, and it begins with understanding of one another. Removing the important lessons of who we are, where we came from, and why things are the way they are robs young minds of the necessary understandings to overcome the hurdles of conflict, genocide, and historical trauma.

If civics is truly to be taught to South Dakota's children, then I remind you that the Doctrine of Discovery is how you justify your behaviors.\_

Article 6 of the United States Constitution states:

"The laws of the United States which shall be made in pursuance thereof; and all treaties made, or which shall be made, under the authority of the United States, shall be the supreme law of the land; and the judges in every state shall be bound thereby, any thing in the Constitution or laws of any state to the contrary notwithstanding."

This means that the treaties made with us are United States treaties, which makes them the supreme law of the land. They must not only be honored, they must be taught so they are not forgotten.

What is even more disturbing is the effect removing our shared history will have on the Lakota children in public schools in the state. Again, they will be relegated to the "bad guy" in every fantasy about the American conquest.

Ignored will be our great leaders, people, culture and contributions. Again, our children will be brainwashed by oppressive versions of our shared history that assimilate them into gratitude for Manifest Destiny, rather than the truths you inflicted, and now wish to erase.

Our children were stolen from us in a past generation, forcefully assimilated or secretly buried in boarding schools under the "kill the Indian and save the man" ideologies, and it would seem that the task to erase them has not ended under Gov. Kristi Noem's administration and leadership.

This message is to our *wakanyeya* (children): They have tried to exterminate or assimilate us and they have failed. You are loved and important to your families and our *Oyate* (Nation). You

deserve to know the truth and you will not get it in South Dakota public schools. They have made that message clear. *Hecetu elo.*

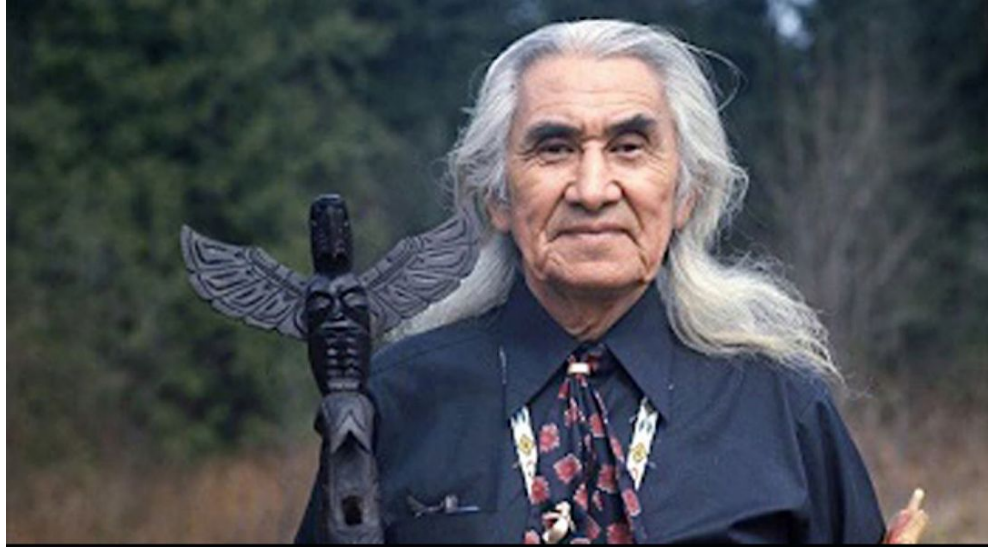

**South Dakota DOE removed Indigenous topics from social studies standards before final draft**

Before the South Dakota Department of Education released a draft of new social studies standards last week, department officials took out more than a dozen references to education on the Oceti Sakowin.

"Oceti Sakowin" refers collectively to the Lakota, Dakota and Nakota people who are indigenous to South Dakota and surrounding states.



"It is hard for me to understand a culture that not only hates and fights his brothers but even attacks Nature and abuses her. Man must love all creation or he will love none of it. Love is something you and I must have. We must have it because our spirit feeds upon it. Without love our self esteem weakens. Without it our courage fails. Without love we can no longer look out confidently at the world. Instead we turn inwardly and begin to feed upon our own personalities and little by little we destroy ourselves."

- In second grade geography, identifying names and locations of Oceti Sakowin Oyate tribes within our communities and state.

  - In fifth grade, standards for learning about tribal sovereignty in civics class and how natural resources and migration affected the lives and culture of the Oceti Sakowin were both removed completely.

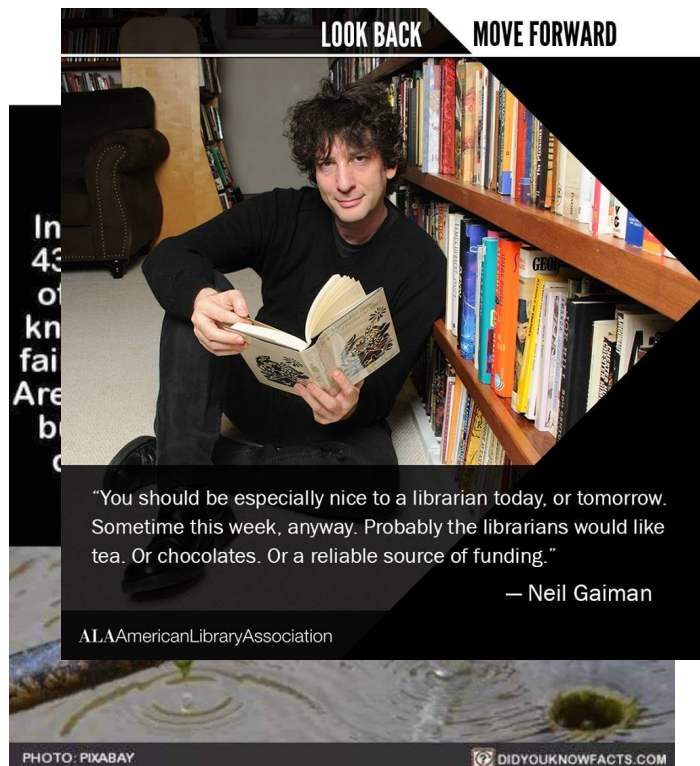

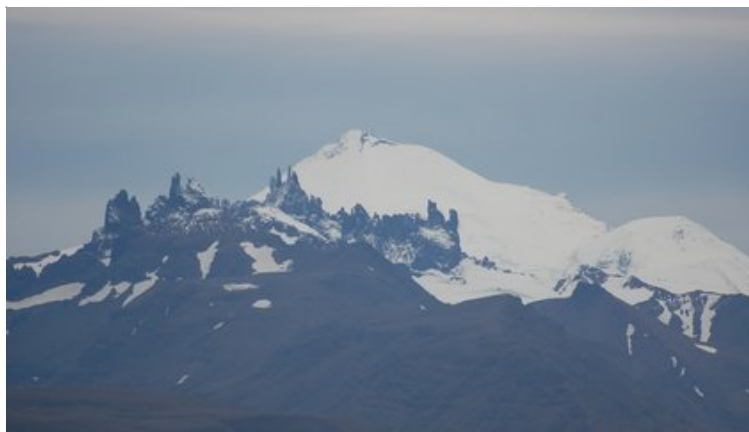

**Before the presidents' faces were carved into Mount Rushmore it was called The Six Grandfathers, part of the sacred Black Hills of the Lakota tribe. The U.S. Government seized the land illegally in 1877, after gold had been discovered there. President Grant secretly ordered the army not to protect local tribes, as bounty hunters collected up to \$300 for each Native American killed. The carving of four presidents into the hills took place in the 1920's, funded in part by the Ku Klux Klan.**

## About the Great Basin Observatory



The Great Basin Observatory (GBO) is the first research grade observatory ever built in a U.S. National Park. Set at an elevation of 6,825 feet, with no significant man-made light for 70 miles in all directions, the observatory is a state-of-the-art, remotely operated, optical astronomical telescope.

The GBO enables researchers to explore fundamental questions about our universe. Its location in Great Basin National Park underscores the need to preserve night skies as a park resource.

### **The GBO's primary goals are to:**

1. Inspire students and educators in the fields of astrophysics and other sciences, technology and natural resource management
2. Provide a state-of-the-art research/education facility and
3. Preserve and utilize the spectacular dark night sky of Great Basin National Park.
