Sometimes called the "**Apache Joan of Arc**," **Lozen** was the sister of a prominent chief and member of the Chiricahua Apaches. Instead of sticking to traditional female roles at the time, she became a medicine woman and used her strategic thinking to help her people fight against the U.S. government.

In 1877, Lozen and her people left their deplorable living conditions at the San Carlos Reservation, also called "Hell's Forty Acres." In the few years after they left, they lost almost half of their people due to raids from the American military. However, Lozen did not give up. She spent six years fighting against the U.S. government alongside famed Apache leader Geronimo until he surrendered in 1885. While imprisoned in Alabama, Lozen died of tuberculosis, but the stories of her bravery and cunning live on.

[Tesoro Cultural Center](#) will once again host its signature events this holiday season: The [Farolito Lighting and Pinecone Ceremony](#) on Sunday, Nov. 28; the [Holiday Auction Party](#) on Sunday, Dec. 5; and [Las Posadas](#) on Christmas Eve, Friday, Dec. 24. The Colorado 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, which celebrates the artistic and cultural treasures of our American past, invites guests to rejoice in the holiday season's festivities at Denver's iconic The Fort Restaurant, located at 19192 Highway 8, in Morrison.

Charlotte and Bob Baron founded Golden, Colo.-based publishing company, Fulcrum Publishing, more than 30 years ago. With a mission to publish authors who inspires readers, the Barons have made a dedicated effort to publish the work of many American Indian authors in order to amplify their perspectives and stories.

As part of the Pinecone Ceremony, guests are given a pinecone and a piece of paper, and are invited to write a message to someone who lives far away or has passed. The message is tucked inside the pinecone and tossed into a bonfire; 19th-century ancestors believed that well-wishes were transported to the heavens as the fire burned the pinecones. Hot cider, Mexican hot chocolate and biscochito cookies will be available during the festivities.

### **Annual Holiday Auction Costume Party, Sunday, Dec. 5, 5-8 p.m.**

In support of Tesoro's ongoing educational programming, the annual Holiday Auction Costume Party takes place from 5-8 p.m. on Dec. 5 at The Fort. Tickets are \$25 and available to [Tesoro members](#), who are welcome to purchase additional tickets for friends and family.

Guests are encouraged to dress in 19th-century attire, with the "best dressed" awarded a prize. The evening includes hearty hors d'oeuvres and drinks from The Fort, live entertainment, and live and silent auctions of items including Native American art, Spanish Colonial art, hand-crafted jewelry and more.

### **Las Posadas, Friday, Dec. 24, 4-5:30 p.m.**

Celebrated in Mexico and throughout the United States during the week leading up to Christmas Eve, Las Posadas commemorates Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem on the night of Jesus' birth. In partnership with The Fraternas, Tesoro Cultural Center produces a condensed version of the tradition, held annually on Christmas Eve, from 4-5:30 p.m. on the grounds of The Fort.

Children are invited to participate in a reenactment of the biblical scene; musicians play customary Las Posadas songs; a seven-pointed piñata is provided for children; and complimentary biscochito cookies, hot cider and Mexican hot chocolate are served. All ages and religious backgrounds are welcome to join in the fun.
