

# **Biden to commit to protecting hundreds of** <u>thousands of acres in Nevada from development</u>, <u>honoring tribes</u>

President Biden will announce Wednesday that he supports a push by the Fort Mojave and 11 other tribes, along with environmentalists and local residents, to protect a broad swath of land in southern Nevada, according to a senior administration official who spoke on the condition of anonymity because the announcement was not yet public. The coalition has been pushing to expand protections around Avi Kwa Ame, or Spirit Mountain. But some developers warn it could hamper the state's renewable energy industry.

"As bad as Covid has been, it's given us an opportunity we didn't have before," said Crowell, who oversees the tribe's housing programs. "Housing is survival," he emphasized. "There are 1,200 of us on the planet. Affordable housing moves our people onto the reservation so we don't lose them. It maintains our culture."

For tribal members, living on the reservation "restores our tribal nation so people have that collective feeling of cultural practice," said Forsman. "It builds relationships that were intentionally broken apart."

# **ARP Funds Affordable Housing**

In 2021, the US government allocated more than <u>\$20 billion</u> directly to some 574 tribal nations across the country as part as of the ARP — a package that represents "the largest infusion of federal funding for Indian Country in the history of the United States," according to researchers at the <u>Harvard Project on American Indian Economic</u> <u>Development</u>. ARP funds offer a "once-in-a-lifetime" chance to transform Native communities, said Joe Kalt, director of the project. Hundreds of US tribes are at varying stages of planning or rolling out their projects, which range from building roads and broadband internet to expanding health care and job training.

"As the world careens toward greater climate instability, driven partly by the depletion of the world's forests, there has never been a greater urgency to reform the building and construction sector. The built environment generates about 40% of planet-warming carbon emissions and the global building floor area is expected to double by 2060, according to Architecture 2030, a climate-centered nonprofit.

While about <u>27%</u> of emissions from the built environment are operational — produced by processes such as cooling, heating or illumination — the rest are embodied in the structures through the extraction, manufacturing and transport of building materials.

Extending the life of existing structures, making them more efficient and reusing materials when properties are torn down offers one of the clearest paths for decarbonizing a sector that single-handedly threatens efforts to keep global warming within the 2C limit set in the 2015 Paris Agreement. "

In 1957, she patented her invention of the baby jumper, under the name Jolly Jumper, making her one of the first Indigenous women in Canada to patent and profit from an invention.

## Dee Numa

Lizzy Toby Peters was a contemporary of the basket weaver Datsolalee. Peters is known for her mastery of traditional Washoe basketry techniques. To ensure consistency in color and texture, Washoe basket weavers harvested different plants at specific times of the year and processed them following distinct protocols. Using such grasses, the artist created boldly graphic containers with geometric designs that expressed both her personal identity and her tribal affiliation.





The N.Y. Times published a fascinating story over the weekend about a **hunting map app called OnX that shows landlocked public lands across the West**. ## The Nevada District Small Business Week Awards Categories:

- Small Business Person of the Year (National and District): Individual or partners who own a small business, which has increased sales, profits and employees, and have been in business for at least three years. Business must have received Small Business Administration assistance.
- **Exporting Small Business of the Year (National and District)**: Small business which has increased sales, profits and/or employees due to exporting and has been in business for at least three years. Business must have received Small Business Administration assistance.
- **Minority Small Business of the Year:** Any small business at least 51% owned and operated by one or more ethnic minority, that have received SBA assistance and been in business for at least three years may be nominated.

- **Family-Owned Small Business of the Year:** Any small business that is family-owned and operated that has received SBA assistance and been in business for at least three years may be nominated.
- Veteran Owned Small Business of the Year: Any small business at least 51% owned by a veteran(s) of the U.S. armed forces which has received SBA assistance and has been in business for at least three years may be nominated.
- Woman Owned Small Business of the Year: Any small business at least 51% owned and operated by one or more woman which has received SBA assistance and has been in business for at least three years may be nominated.
- **Rural Owned Small Business of the Year:** Any small rural business that has received SBA assistance and has been in business for at least three years may be nominated.
- Micro Enterprise Business of the Year: Any microenterprise business with five or less employees that has received SBA assistance and has been in business for three years may be nominated.
- Young Entrepreneur of the Year: Any small business, at least 51% owned and operated by one or more individuals that are 30 or who will not have reached the age of 30 by June 1, 2023, that has received SBA assistance and has been in business for at least three years may be nominated
- Entrepreneurial Spirit of the Year: Any individual or company in Nevada who best demonstrates a pattern of promotional support to entrepreneurial activities and small businesses in the state. Nominees may or may not be small business owners may be nominated.
- Legacy Small Business of the Year: Any individual or partners who own a small business, which has increased sales, profits, and employees, and has been in business for at least twenty-five years. Business must have received Small Business Administration assistance.
