Leonard Peltier is the longest-serving Indigenous political prisoner in United States history. For nearly 50 years, Indigenous activists, organizers, and allies have spoken out against his long and unjust incarceration. Leonard's 79th Birthday Action is an opportunity for us to come together in our collective power to advocate for his freedom.

Do you have a four-year college degree? Have you used Indian Health Service? Referred Purchase Care? Do you know how Tribal governments work? Are you comfortable speaking in front of people?

The Nevada Indian Commission and the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services is looking for an employee to do presentations to Tribal Councils, Tribal health directors, humans services coordinators, health professionals, and Native American Tribal members regarding DHHS services, programs, and health related areas.

The position will report back to DHHS with recommendations for new programs or expansion of services, for funding and staff suggestions all of which will improve the health and quality of life for our Tribal citizens.

This job will help develop and revise policies and procedures with written reports that ensure compliance with state and federal laws and regulations.

Also, this position will work closely with the DHHS Legislative Liaison who will coordinate and analyze the impact of proposed legislation in conjunction with the DHHS' five (5) divisions.

You must have a valid Nevada driver's license and pass a State of Nevada/FBI fingerprint-based background check. Besides health insurance, paid leave, and retirement pay, the salary range for this position called a MANAGEMENT ANALYST, is from \$53,390.16 - \$78,884.64.

The [Urban Waters Learning Network](#) is hosting a webinar series to highlight a variety of strategies that community-based organizations can use to help their communities anticipate, prepare for, and respond to climate risks such as flooding, coastal storms and drought, with a focus on protecting community members who are most vulnerable to climate threats.

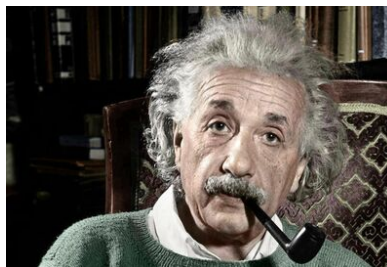

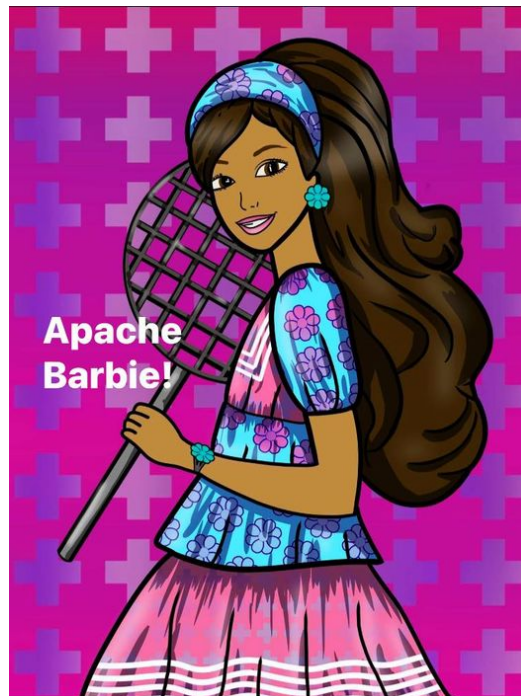
