The new plan would also limit, but not outright ban, drilling in an additional 2.4 million acres of the NPR-A, and support subsistence activities for Alaska Native communities.

Pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 445B, the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 445B, and the Clean Air Act, the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is issuing the following Notice of Proposed Action.

The Director received an application for a revision of Class II Air Quality Operating Permit, AP2491-0095.05 (FIN A0499) from the following applicant:

SJC - Silver Springs 1680 Spruce Avenue Silver Springs, NV 89429

SJC – Silver Springs – Wood Treating Facility is located at 1680 Spruce Avenue, Silver Springs, Nevada, South of US Hwy 50 and US 95 Alt South Intersection. SJC is located in a portion of Section 30, Township 18 N, Range 25 E, M.D.B.&M.

SJC treats wood products such as rail ties, telephone poles, and building lumber to resist attack from insect (termite, wood borers, etc.) and wood rot (fungi, bacteria, etc.) attack. The revision will allow for increases in heat input rating for the two existing permitted boilers and replace an existing 9,392 gallon water evaporation tank (an insignificant activity) with a 9,600 gallon water evaporation tank (an insignificant activity).

On the basis of the preliminary review and the requirements of the NRS, the NAC and the Clean Air Act, the Director is hereby announcing his intent to issue the proposed Class II Air Quality Operating Permit based on a review of the information submitted. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics estimated that data scientists will be one of the fastestgrowing—and highest-paying—occupations in the coming years. There are nearly half a million open jobs in data analytics, paying a median entry-level salary of \$92,000, according to <u>Google</u>.

To help fill that demand, at least eight local colleges are participating in a regional joint venture to invest in artificial intelligence and data analytics programming <u>through the Bay Area</u> <u>Community College Consortium</u>. Additional colleges, such as Skyline College in San Bruno, signed up to receive curriculum updates to help create their own.

This helps bring lucrative work opportunities to community college students, who tend to be older than four-year university students and from lower-income backgrounds.

A federal judge has dealt another serious setback to the proposed Twin Metals copper-nickel mine near the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness in northeastern Minnesota, dismissing the company's lawsuit that sought to regain the critical mineral rights leases that the Biden administration cancelled. Twin Metals, a subsidiary of the Chilean mining company Antofagasta, said in a statement that it was "disappointed" by the decision and was "working to determine next steps."
