Cannupa Hanksa Luger’s “Speechless” Explores Cargo Cults

Reno, NV (October 7, 2023) –Multi-disciplinary artist Cannupa Hanksa Luger—who is of Mandan, Hidatsa, Arikara, Lakota, and European descent—takes his inspiration for the forthcoming exhibition *Speechless* from the historical phenomenon known as cargo cults—a unique occurrence that developed as a result of military campaigns occupying and delivering supplies to areas already inhabited by Indigenous populations. For example, this happened in the South Pacific when the US military was based there during World War II. Cults formed around the introduction of foreign food and necessities that seemed to magically drop from the sky, when in fact it was occupying forces bringing shiploads and planeloads of cargo as they colonized Indigenous lands.

The exhibition, on view at the Nevada Museum of Art from October 7, 2023 to June 2, 2024, offers a glimpse into Luger’s futuristic, aesthetic realm that is rooted in the formation of new narratives that speak to the complexity and syncretic nature of contemporary life. “As a Native contemporary artist and craftsperson of North America, I am motivated to reclaim and reframe a more accurate version of 21st Century Indigenous culture and its powerful global relevance,” Luger has stated. In *Speechless*, Luger importantly asks the critical questions relating to language, human agency, and implements of control. Who gets to speak? Who has to bite their tongue? Luger further asserts, “Communication is the root of all ritual and technological development. How to amplify, translate, respond and receive? Whether in relation to our environment, each other, the ancestors, spirit, or the universe itself, desire and the function of speech is the same—to make contact and connect. The exhibition flips the Western gaze back on itself to reflect that in present day North American culture, we are all in a cargo cult. Devoting our lives to the ‘unnamed gods’ of consumption, wealth and fame, we emulate those who have what we want in the manner of an arcane ritual—prayerful action without practical understanding of who we are performing for, or of what we are petitioning.”

Speechless will feature a monumental new installation of a large-scale radio tower made of lodgepole and white pine poles that echo cargo cult structures. The installation will also include Native American bustles made with intricate handmade paper feathers that were completed during Luger’s recent residency at Dieu Donn  in New York.

Additionally, ceramic and mixed media speakers will surround the tower. Painted in Luger’s bright, colorful palette, speaker cones display teeth that bite down on tongues. In Luger’s installation there is no sound, and yet the objects, colors, and forms assembled in the space of the museum speak volumes and produce a visual symphony of signs and symbols. As Luger states, “Within the cargo cult of contemporary art, proximity to power is often subliminally (and sometimes explicitly) reliant on saying only what power wants one to say.” Funding Availability for FY 2024 Brownfields Multipurpose, Assessment, and Cleanup Grants

NCRCRD 2023-2024 Funding Opportunities Now Available!

Each year North Central Regional Center for Rural Development (NCRCRD) offers multiple types of grants to enhance the ability of the North Central Region's thirty-four land-grant institutions to contribute to the success of the region's rural communities. This year NCRCRD is offering [five funding opportunities](#) and looks to award multiple projects for each grant.

The RFPs include:

- **Working Groups:** Funding up to \$50,000 over three years (Apply year-round)
- **Small Grants:** Funding up to \$40,000 (Proposals due January 15, 2024)
- **1994 Land Grant Innovation Grants:** Funding up to \$35,000 (Proposals due January 15, 2024)
- **North Central Region Extension Collaboration and Implementation Grant:** Funding up to \$5,000 (Apply year-round)
- **NCRCRD 2024 Fellow:** Funding up to \$25,000 for one year. (Apply year-round)

NCRCRD grants support new and ongoing regional research, extension, and integrated activities. Eligible applicants include current faculty and staff of Land Grant institutions (LGIs) in the North Central Region (NCR) and their partners. Funds awarded range from \$5,000 - \$50,000 and all projects must relate to the Center's three priority areas of work — Creating Resilient Communities and Economies, Developing Leadership and Civic Engagement, and Promoting Community Health and Wellness.

Now Open: 2023 Clean School Bus Rebate Program

EPA has announced the [2023 Clean School Bus \(CSB\) Rebate Program](#)! This is the second rebate funding opportunity through the multi-year funding program. Under the 2023 Rebate Program, EPA anticipates awarding at least \$500 million in rebate funding with the potential to modify this figure based on the application pool and other factors.

Eligible applicants can apply to receive funding for the purchase of up to 25 zero-emission (ZE) and/or clean school buses, along with ZE charging infrastructure and eligible workforce development costs. Selectees may be eligible for Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) tax credits applicable to their bus and infrastructure purchases. For example, the [Clean Vehicle tax credits](#) for qualifying school buses are worth up to \$40,000.

EPA is prioritizing applications that will replace buses serving high-need local education agencies, rural areas, Tribal school districts funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and public school districts receiving basic support payments for students living on Tribal land. In addition, EPA is committed to ensuring the CSB Program delivers on the Biden-Harris Administration's Justice40 Initiative that at least 40% of the benefits of certain federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities.

Applicants must submit all application materials via the online portal by **January 31st, 2024, at 4 PM ET.**

EPA plans to host a series of public webinars regarding this rebate funding opportunity from September through January to provide potential applicants with an overview of the program, relevant information, and available resources. Note: Eligible applicants can apply for all future funding opportunities under the CSB Program, regardless of whether they applied for and/or received funding under a past funding opportunity; however, they need to submit a new application for each funding opportunity. Potential applicants who made a [SAM.gov](#) account in the last year should verify it is still active ASAP. Accounts that have not been accessed in 365 days will go inactive. ### **Spring 2024 Teaching with Primary Sources (TPS) Internship Program**

The Library of Congress is accepting applications for Spring 2024 Teaching with Primary Sources Internship Program opportunities until November 3, 2023.

The Library's Teaching with Primary Sources (TPS) program is administered by the Professional Learning and Outreach Initiatives Office. Through this program, the Library offers teaching materials, professional development, and partnership opportunities focused on the educational use of the Library's digitized primary sources.

The [TPS Consortium](#) is a nationwide network of partner organizations that delivers educational programming, and creates teaching materials and tools based on the Library's digitized primary sources and other online resources. This work supports the Library's mission to use its collections to connect with those representing diverse communities, beliefs, and endeavors to engage, inspire, and inform Congress and the American people with a universal and enduring source of knowledge and creativity.

The TPS Internship Program offers onsite and remote opportunities for interns to help Library staff and TPS Consortium members incorporate the Library's collections of digitized primary sources into high-quality educational programming and materials. Interns will gain valuable, collaborative work experience by exploring educational resources, applying learning strategies, and connecting through partnerships. A key component of the TPS Internship Program is

researching and contributing content about new discoveries and reflections to the TPS Teachers Network, culminating in a special project.

Whether remote or onsite, TPS interns will engage with TPS Consortium members and the more than 14,000 educators belonging to the TPS Teachers Network. In addition, the onsite TPS intern will support the Library's in-person programming for young visitors ages 9+ and their families by developing an onsite component based on their research.

TPS interns will:

- identify materials and learning strategies that use digitized Library resources to effectively support K-12 student and teacher audiences
- learn about the Library, its collections and programs
- help to plan and support primary source-based educational programming targeting K-12 student and teacher audiences
- design and implement a special project as described in the application materials
- conduct research and consult with Library experts to inform internship work
- share insights and engage in online discussions on the [TPS Teachers Network](#)
- (onsite only) engage young visitors ages 9+ and their families with primary source and collection-based activities

The onsite TPS intern will work up to 35 hours per week from 9:00 am – 4:30 pm, five days a week. One of these days must include Saturday. The Library is closed on Sunday.

The remote TPS intern will work 20 hours per week, Monday- Friday, and determine their actual work schedule with Library staff. The remote TPS intern must be able to work at least part of their weekly schedule between the hours of 9:30 am and 3:00 pm Eastern Time.
