New State Health Improvement Plan places focus on healthcare access, mental healthBy Kevin Sheridan Published: Feb. 27, 2024 at 11:22 AM PST

RENO, Nev. (KOLO) - The new Nevada State Health Improvement Plan is highlighting access to healthcare, mental health and substance use, as well as other items as health needs.

The Nevada Division of Public and Behavorial Health published <u>the report</u> last week. The first of its kind report is produced by the DPBH and the University of Nevada, Reno.

"The State Health Improvement Plan provides a roadmap for state government and community partners to work together to improve the health of all in the Silver State," DPBH Administrator Cody Phinney said. "I'm grateful to the members of the steering committee, subcommittees and subject matter experts who contributed time and expertise to develop timely, actionable goals and objectives to improve the health of Nevadans — and look forward to working collectively to address these critical health needs."

It was developed with input from around 100 representatives of state and local government, tribal partners and organizations involved in public health. 15 goals were established under four strategic priorities: access to health care; mental health and substance use; social determinants of health; and public health infrastructure.

Three rare species found in Nevada may warrant endangered species protections RENO, Nev. (KOLO) - Conservationists are keeping an eye on some rare species that may warrant special protections.

A flower, a toad, and a rabbit, all have one thing in common. They're facing potential protections under the Endangered Species Act. Patrick Donnelly, the Great Basin Director for the Center of Biological Diversity says that mining, residential development, and urban expansion are all variables in habitat loss - the driving factor in most species becoming endangered. Those species are the Railroad Valley toad — one of the smallest western toad species, the Carson City Monkey Flower, and the pygmy rabbit — a small rabbit found in the Great Basin.

"We would prefer that species not get so threatened they need this protection in the first place, but the reality is, we are in an extinction crisis," Donnelly said.

The iconic Carson City Monkey Flower once carpeted the capital city. But, to date, has lost 40 % of its habitat and Donnelly says, it's happening in real time.

"As we were doing surveys for this endangered act petition we saw Carson City Monkey Flowers getting bulldozed for a housing development," said Donnelly.

But even environments lost naturally are causing problems when it comes to protecting biodiversity. Sage brush destroyed by wildfires is causing a rapid decline in pygmy rabbits.

"We feel like the pygmy rabbit is spiraling towards extinction," said Donnelly.

Extinction isn't always a numbers game. Donnelly says it's not always the lack in population that can get animals onto the Endangered Species List, but how wide spread they are. Or, in the case of the Railroad Valley toad, how narrowly distributed they are. Under their review, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service found there were credible threats to the rare toads' existence that warranted further analysis, including oil and gas extraction in Railroad Valley, and proposals for lithium extraction.
