



The U.S. Department of Labor announces \$312 million in grant funding for the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) Grants. The purpose of the program is to provide subsidized, part-time community service training for unemployed, low-income adults ages 55 and older with low employment prospects.

Authorized by the Older Americans Act, SCSEP provides subsidized, part-time community service training for unemployed, low-income adults, ages 55 and older with low employment prospects. SCSEP funding will allow grantees to assign older participants to various community service roles at non-profit and public facilities, such as day care centers, senior centers, schools, and hospitals. The community service assignments aim to promote self-sufficiency for participants and serve as a bridge to unsubsidized employment.

To be eligible for SCSEP National Grant funding under this Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), an applicant must be a non-profit organization, Federal public agency, or Tribal organization that demonstrates the ability to administer a multi-state SCSEP program – see section II.A.4 of the FOA. The Department plans to award approximately 10 to 22 grants.

HUD issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) which appropriates \$225 million in grant funding for the PRESERVATION AND REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE FOR COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT (PRICE) program. PRICE supports communities in their efforts to maintain, protect, and stabilize manufactured housing and manufactured housing communities (MHCs). Tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHEs) are eligible to apply, and at least \$10 million of the available funding is intended for Tribal communities. ## History Nuggets for the Week

- 1880 April 11** Council of Washo asked state/fed officials to stop destruction of pinenut trees.
- 1890 April 10** Native Americans at Wadsworth held a dance to which they invited all “Washoe boys to come down.”
- 1897 April 8** A jury was named in the Dayton trial of a man name Logan for the murder of a Piute named Jim King, and Native Americans were crowding onto the town.
- 1935 April 13** Goshute acquired 3493.5 acres.
- 1942 April 14** The Nevada State Journal editorialized in support of establishment of a Navy training center at Pyramid Lake.
- 1961 April 13** Native American leaders representing tribes in Utah, California and Reno met with Kennedy administration officials on proposals for reform of the BIA.
- 1964 April 11** At a Reno inter-tribal meeting, held outside the authority of the BIA, Native Americans from 7 states criticized the Bureau and asked the public for understanding of problems.
- 1966 April 8** Ely Colony adopted its Constitution
- 1968 April 12** The American Indian Civil Rights Act is passed
- 1978 April 8** Congress passed PL 95-337 (92Stat455) for Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe
- 1990 April 12** The Ely Shoshone Tribe formally adopted the National Agenda for American Indian/Alaska Native Youth.

**Sixty-two years later:**

In 1962, *The New Yorker* magazine published the first of a series of articles by science writer **Rachel Carson** about the dangerous side effects of pesticides. Those articles formed the basis for Carson’s ground-breaking book, *Silent Spring*, released later that year. Today, the magazine continues to publish science journalism by writers like Elizabeth Kolbert, whose reporting on climate change first appeared in *The New Yorker* in 2005. American Experience spoke to Kolbert about the difficult work of a science journalist and why she keeps doing it, **in this interview**, excerpted below.
